s a recovering codependent, I know all too well what energy can be spent on things totally outside of my control & responsibility, while neglecting what's directly in my power. I now know God wants my heart to be *free* to worship him instead of in bondage to useless strategies.

Just because I care about it doesn't mean I'm supposed to care for it. But sometimes that can feel downright confusing! That's why I like to visually define what's mine, what's not, and what I can give to my all powerful God with a "Circle of Control"!

God is serious about his children exercising *their* ordained rights and responsibilities, led by the Holy Spirit, while giving *others* permission to do the same.

We are limited. But *God* is not! He is a good Father that we can trust with our deepest desires- especially what we have no control over.

We don't have to scrounge for what we need because God gives us everything we need, including blessings we don't work for! (2 Peter 1:3, Psalm 127:2). He is all Relieving other's guilt

Surrender reveals God's perfect provision and builds confidence in his protection that even our best boundaries couldn't accomplish. It postures us to fully embrace and celebrate God's creative movement in our lives and the lives of others as we release our expectations of the "what" and "how" to him.

Godly self control allows our energy and creativity to be spent on what has a healthy eternal impact. It protects us from making people into idols, bitterness, and confusing personal responsibility. It minimizes distraction and positions our hearts to worship God freely. (Galatians 6:4-5)

Together, surrender and self control free us to discover that *Godly success is not always determined* by an ultimate outcome or by another person's response to us, but by growing intimate with *God in the process.*

Identifying what's not ours to control provides an opportunity to give our concerns back to the one who makes all things work for the good of those who love Him, which is why I love writing out the circle of control on paper. (Romans 8:28) I like to physically throw my hands into the air as I name out loud what I am giving back to God's trustworthy hands as an outward expression of "casting my cares" on Him. (1 Peter 5:7)

BUILDING FAITH OVER FEAR

aith and fear both demand our focus, so we must intentionally decide which we will choose. Fear cripples but God's truth sets us free. We build our faith by talking back to fear. Fear isn't consistent with God's truth. God has told us that He hasn't given us a spirit of fear, but instead, of power, love, and the mind of Christ (see 2 Tim. 1:7).

When you recognize worry, fear, or anxiety, tell it "No!" Then thank God that He hasn't given you the spirit of fear. Thank Him that He promises in his word to keep you in perfect peace when your mind is kept on Him (see Is. 26:3). *Then*, keep your mind on Him, not all the possible outcomes. He will take care of the outcome.


Scripture reminds us that "Faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ" (Rom. 10:17 ESV). When we recite Scripture out loud, we hear it and it builds our faith! When you recognize fear assaulting you, refuse to entertain it, but instead quote applicable scripture to refute it (like Psalm 34:4 or Isaiah 41:10).

Instead of focusing on the problem, keep your attention focused on the Problem-Solver. We become fearful, worried and anxious when we take our attention off God and instead focus on our circumstances. The key to building our faith and maintaining or regaining our peace is to keep our thoughts focused on God, just as we are told in Isaiah 26:3, "You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you!"

Ambrose Redmoon said, "Courage is not the absence of fear, but rather the judgment that something else is more important than fear." We have to come to the place where we choose to trust the sovereignty of God more than what we see or feel. We all experience crises of faith from time to time, but that's when we do just as the father of the boy with the unclean spirit did as he approached Jesus for his son's healing, and confess to God, "I believe; help my unbelief!" (see Mark 9:24). That is a prayer our heavenly father loves to answer, because nothing pleases Him more than we believe in Him and trust Him. "And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him" (Heb. 11:6 NIV).







What is Your Spiritual Pain?

You no longer have to fear the darkness. The light of the world is here!

Spiritual pain can follow physical pain, emotional pain, relational pain, grief and loss. This can be devastating, as the spiritual pain inflicted by the enemy drives a wedge between you and God, hindering the healing process. In other words, it compounds our wounds. That dark, dark stubborn cloud of depression can settle heavy on our hearts.

But with God's help, you can heal. Healing begins when we recognize that spiritual pain is often the unseen wound beneath the surface and pretending or pushing the pain down does not work. No matter what you're going through, know that you're not alone. Together with God, we can ALWAYS find the light in the darkest of moments.



WHAT IS GASLIGHTING?

hen a woman shows up with a black eye or broken arm at the hands of her spouse, abuse is obvious. When she lives with a broken spirit, the effects of abuse are just as real, but less obvious. God tells us a broken spirit is damaging and hard to live with (Proverbs 18:14).

Gaslighting is a form of covert abuse. It's become a kind of buzz-word lately so you may have heard the term but what is gaslighting? How do you deal with it in your personal relationships?

The word actually comes from a famous movie released in the 40's called "Gaslight." It's about an accomplished opera singer named Paula who falls in love with and marries a man named Gregory Anton. Gregory begins to torture his wife, not physically but psychologically. He manipulates things around the house. For instance, he would dim the lights in the house. When Paula mentioned it, Gregory would say it's her imagination. He hides things that Paula puts in a certain place, and when she can't find them puts them back. He accuses her of going crazy and, with his manipulations, she begins to believe him.

When you hear the term "gaslighting" it means a very intentional form of psychological manipulation. It's a way of confusing, controlling, and intimidating someone to the point that she begins to doubt her memory and her own reality. This leads to believing that marital problems are her fault.

The ultimate goal of gaslighting is to destroy a person's self-confidence so she can't function independently. She stops trusting her own judgement and becomes unable to make decisions. Realize...this can happen over time without anyone so much as raising their voice. This type of covert abuser often appears like the "good guy" because his cruel behavior is hidden from those around him.

It's important to understand the stages of gaslighting. There are three of them:

Stage One: Create Confusion

In this stage your words are often twisted into something you never said. If you try to explain, it's common to be labeled a liar. Realize that this is not a communication problem. It's intentional. Your partner knows what you said and what you meant.

Stage Two: Defensiveness

Even the most mundane and normal of concerns have you being called controlling, judgmental, self-righteous. Suddenly, it doesn't matter what he's done... you're the nag, the abusive one and he is the victim. Defending yourself usually leads to a huge argument and goes nowhere. Enough experiences in this stage and you'll start to doubt yourself and believe the labels he puts on you.

Stage Three: Depression and Emptiness

You've changed. Before you knew your own mind. Now you doubt yourself. Before you were confident in your abilities. Now you don't even know who you are. You've accepted the things your husband has said about you as truth. His opinion of you is gospel and you find yourself in a pattern of apologizing as well as feeling insecure and self-conscious. Your reality is one of depression and emptiness.

But a little clarity could go a long way here. So let's shed some light on what's really going on:

Covert "Crazymaking."

- Information is distorted or outright withheld but he swears you were told everything. You "must have forgotten." You misunderstood. That didn't happen. Soon you're doubting your version of reality.
- 2. He says something hurtful. Something he knows will make you feel insecure. When you object he accuses you of overreacting or being too sensitive. He "didn't mean it" or you "misunderstood." Ultimately, you're the one who is apologizing!
- 3. Minimizing is an almost daily occurrence. "It's not that big a deal."
- 4. Excuses are another major pastime for the gaslighter. His actions are always someone else's fault. (Usually yours.)
- 5. Deflecting your concerns or feelings or confrontations as crazy, ridiculous, unimportant, or ungodly. You're bad, he's good. You're wrong, he's right.

So, how do you deal with gaslighting?

- 1. When you're having a conversation, record it or write down what's being said. You can simply say, "I'm tired of being told I don't remember what you said." This puts him on notice that his tactic of purposely leaving out information and accusing you of forgetfulness will not work anymore.
- 2. When he says something cruel, write down his exact words. This way he cannot edit his words to be a watered-down version of the truth.
- 3. When he minimizes by saying something isn't a big deal it's okay to tell him you disagree. You can calmly say, "I do think it's a big deal and I'm going to discuss it with our pastor." This sends a message that his words and actions will no longer be a secret and you are no longer going to defend yourself to him.
- 4. Stick with the facts and stick with his actions. When he tries to blame you or someone else, simply say, "No. There are plenty of people who have been in a similar situation and made different decisions. You are responsible for your own choices." Then stop. Don't ask for an apology. Don't ask him to acknowledge the truth. Just stop. You've made it clear you will not be manipulated.

Healthy people work on their shortcomings. They acknowledge their sinful nature and work to change. You can't do that for your husband but, with God's help, you can work on yourself so that he no longer has the power to rob you of your reality, your confidence, and your self-respect.







In 1976, just three years after abortion became legal in all states, I chose the easy way out of an unplanned pregnancy, the result of living immorally and had an abortion. Although I experienced immediate relief, something else was lost that day. I felt it but didn't know what it was and wouldn't get relief until many years later. It was post-abortion pain, shame, and guilt. Through God's grace, He led me to a Bible study group specifically for women to receive God's forgiveness and begin the healing process for my abortion choice. I have been involved in Post-Abortion Ministry for 35 years. Currently, I serve as the leader of a Bible Study ministry for post-abortion women at my local Pregnancy Resource Center and share my personal testimony anytime I have the opportunity.

Several years back, somehow, I signed up to receive Aliene's email devotionals. Those emails seemed to speak just to me. (I often wondered if she had a secret camera in my home!!) The wisdom Aliene shared was so spot on! Many of them I printed out to keep and also forwarded to other women I thought would benefit from it. I have also used several of her "spot-on" devotionals with the ladies in the post-abortion groups. In August 2021, I realized I needed and wanted to study God's Word more thoroughly to learn more about Him and His love for me. Although I had called myself a Christian for many years, believed His atonement for me on the cross, and accepted His forgiveness, reading the Bible was a struggle for me. I also had to admit that I didn't really know God and His Word, nor did I feel His love for me. I wanted that to change.

I decided to explore the Nourish Method that Aliene mentioned in her emails.

It is hard to put down in just a few words how Aliene's devotionals and the Nourish Bible Study Method have radically changed my relationship with the Lord. Using Nourish, I have gotten to know God better. Instead of just reading the Word, the Nourish Method helps me dig deeper, specifically looking for the ways God shows His love for me and why I can trust Him. And, more surprising to me, I used to hear people talk about God's promises (the only one I knew about was the promise illustrated by the rainbow after the flood)! Now, I recognize promises for me throughout the Bible and record those promises! Using the Nourish Method has helped me develop a truly intimate relationship with God.

It is hard to put down in just a few words how Aliene's devotionals and the Nourish Bible Study Method have radically changed my relationship with the Lord. Using Nourish, I have gotten to know God better."

And because I have come to truly love my Lord and Saviour, I am able to share more boldly and lovingly with other women I meet.





Unlike other Bible study methods I've tried, which feature a couple of the questions similar to the Nourish Method, like "What does this passage help us learn about God?" or "How will you specifically put this passage into practice?"; I found these questions from other methods far too broad to be of much personal use and boring, like those I heard in "Sunday school." The Nourish Method breaks these questions down even further and makes it more personal. "What does this passage help us learn about God?" becomes more specifically, "What attributes of God do I see that help me trust Him?", "Is there a promise for me to believe?", "Is there an affirmation that tells me how God sees me?" Nourish leads me to probe deeper into Biblical passages and is helping me grasp "how wide, how deep, how great is His love for me."

The combination of the questions, camping out for a whole week on a passage, the Nourish Notebook with all its sections, and the Anchor of Truth cards, The Nourish Method, is helping me grow my faith and go through the tough personal times that Jesus said we all will have. (John 16:33)

The flexibility of the Nourish Method lends itself to apply to personal reading time in the Bible, a book study, or sermons. I feel blessed to be at a church where the pastor teaches expository, or verse by verse, through entire books of the Bible. So, I use the Nourish Method to supplement the sermon and help me remember the teaching.

Last fall, I was asked to lead a women's life group. I accepted, but only on the condition that they agreed to use the Nourish Method!

Several of them had been involved in Bible Study Fellowship for years, but when I explained the Nourish Method, they eagerly wanted to try it.

They have also grown in their personal faith walk!

When I was creating this design for the T-shirt, I picked this verse because I believe ...


If every woman realized how amazing God thinks she is,

YOU ARE THE ONE

SONG OF SOLOMON 1:6

hese words pierced my soul and sent me to the floor weeping. Suddenly I knew that I was loved by God in a way that I cannot even describe. I knew, also, that my vineyard was my own intimate relationship with Him and that I'd been attending to everyone else's but not my own. There was no condemnation, only an understanding of this that was overwhelmed by a greater knowing of His ravished love for me. I later wept on the phone to my parents, "I didn't know He loved me like that!" I was bare before Him and more loved than I ever could have imagined.

I had just opened up to the Song of Solomon after some resistance to the Holy Spirit's promptings. Leading up to this time I had literally worked myself sick trying to please everyone and was sitting at home with walking pneumonia. Having to say "no" was the bane of my existence in my early twenties, but the pressures had become too great, and now I was having to say it to seemingly everyone in my life. I simply could not meet everyone's expectations of me, especially my own. As this breaking had been going on I had also been experiencing a hunger for God like never before. I had told Him I wanted all He had to give.

This love transcended all the hurt and rejection of my past and the subsequent striving to prove my worth that I didn't know had been driving me. That couple of weeks of being shut up in

my room with Him changed the orientation of my life. I couldn't wait to be alone with Him, and everything else was the overflow. It was somewhere in this season that I wrote the first two verses and the bridge to this song. "You are

the One, You are the One, You are the One for whom my heart sings." I have shared it with very few over the years, and honestly it felt incomplete.




